#### ANNEX 1 – Mandatory Conditions

1. A1.  
No supply of alcohol may be made under the Premises Licence at a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence or at a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his/her licence is suspended.
  - A2.  
Every supply of alcohol under the Premises Licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence.
  - A3.  
Each individual in the premises to carry out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority unless the premises or part of the premises where they are present are being used wholly or mainly as a restaurant or guest house, or for theatrical performances, plays or a Gaming Licence is for the time being in force in respect of those premises.
  - A4.  
When a film is exhibited, admission of children to that part of the premises must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the appropriate film classification body in relation to that film.
  - A5.  
Where no recommendation exists from the appropriate film classification body or the Council notifies the premises under section 20(3)(b) Licensing Act 2003, the admission of children will be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the Council.
- The following conditions came into force on 6th April 2010, amended with effect from 1st October 2014
- A6.  
(1)  
The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -

- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
  - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
  - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

A7.

The responsible person must ensure that free potable tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The following conditions came into force on 1st October 2010, amended with effect from 1st October 2014

A8.

- (1) The Premises Licence holder or Club Premises Certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The Designated Premises Supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either -
  - (a) a holographic mark, or
  - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

A9.

The responsible person must ensure that -

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
  - (i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
  - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
  - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

The following condition came into force on 28th May 2014

A10.

A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

For the purpose of the condition set out in paragraph 1 -

(a)

'duty' is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979 [1];

(b)

'permitted price' is the price found by applying the formula  $P = D + (D \times V)$ , where

P - is the permitted price

D - is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

V - is the rate of Value Added Tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the Value Added Tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c)

'relevant person' means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a Premises Licence -

(i)

the holder of the Premises Licence

(ii)

the Designated Premises Supervisor (if any) in respect of such a Licence, or

(iii)

the Personal Licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a Licence;

(d)

'relevant person' means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a Club Premises Certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e)

'Value Added Tax' means Value Added Tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994 [2].

Where the permitted price given by paragraph(b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

[1] Sub-paragraph 2 applies where the permitted price given by paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ('the first day') would be different from the permitted price on the next day ('the second day') as a result of a change to the rate of duty or Value Added Tax.

[2] The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

### ANNEX 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

2. a) General - all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e)

As per below. Suggested new conditions.

b) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

1. A colour CCTV system will be installed in the premises and will display on any recording, the date and time of the recording.
2. The system will be operated during all permitted hours.
3. The CCTV cameras shall be sufficient in number to view any area where licensable activities take place and any exit / entry and the area immediately outside the main entrance.

4. Signs will be displayed in the premises to indicate that CCTV is in use and when dealing with incidents or unruly behaviour, staff shall indicate that CCTV is recording the incident.
5. The system is kept in a working order, is checked regularly and any faults are rectified promptly.
6. A minimum of 6 CCTV cameras in use both internally and externally.
7. Images and recordings will be kept for a minimum of 28 days and made available to Police and Authorised Officers of Pendle Council.
8. Images / recordings provided to the above officers within 48 hours on a USB memory disk or DVD or any other recognised format along with necessary software supplied by the Licence holder and staff will be trained on the use of the system.
9. 'Challenge 25' policy in place at the premises with posters displayed on the entrance doors and behind the bar as well as around the premises. Acceptable ID will be valid passport, DVLA driving licence, 'Prove it' / Citizens Card.
10. Staff trained prior to beginning employment and every 12 months in relation to under-age sales which will be fully documented, and training logs made available to the Police and Authorised Officers of Pendle Borough Council.
11. All staff engaged in the sale of alcohol to complete the on-line 'Lancashire County Council - Challenge 25' awareness training whilst available on-line.
12. This should be done on a 12 monthly rolling basis and initially within 4 weeks of employment paid or otherwise at the premises.

14. Training records shall be kept on the premises for a period of 12 months and produced to the Police or an 'Authorised Person' (as defined by section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or Authorised Trading Standards personnel of the Local Authority / Council on demand.
15. The Premises Licence holder / Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) will be responsible for the storage and production of such training records.
16. No irresponsible drinks promotions at any time.
17. To comply with any reasonable request of the Police / Pendle Borough Council Licensing / Environmental Health during any large events or any other event happening within the premises or within the town.
18. Be an active member of any local Pub Watch scheme or similar.
19. SIA registered Door Supervisors to be used as and when required, requested by the Police / Pendle Borough Council Licensing or if requested by Lancashire Police and Pendle Borough Council Licensing Officer during large events within the Town.
20. Door Supervisors to sign in a proper bound book to include their full name, badge numbers, expiry dates, start times of shift and finish times.
21. The door staff to also have an incident book to complete to record any incidents such as fights, refusals, ejections from premises and any other incidents.
22. The above signing in and incident books to be kept for a minimum of six months and kept in safe storage by the Premises Licence holders / management at the premises.
23. The premises will refuse service to anyone who is causing any anti-social behaviour, and they will be asked to leave the premises immediately.

24. Firefighting equipment and First Aid available for use by staff and kept up to date with regular servicing with a member of staff trained in their use always on duty.

25. Premises will operate a 'No Vaping' policy within the premises.

d) The Prevention of Public Nuisance

26. Notices displayed throughout the premises requesting customers to leave the premises quietly and not to cause nuisance when leaving.

27. No loud music will be played which will be audible at the curtilage of the nearest residential property / flat. Management to ensure this condition is complied with regular checks.

28. All windows and closed will be kept closed when 'live' entertainment is taking place except for entrance and egress from the premises by customers.

29. Rubbish / Bottle bins will only be emptied during the day and not after 8.00pm.

e) The Protection of Children from Harm

30. No children under the age of 18 years will be allowed onto the premises where alcohol is served unless accompanied by an appropriate parent / adult who must not be consuming any alcohol.

31. All children under 18 years of old will have to leave the premises by 21:00hrs on any given trading day.
