The Graveyard in Earby is rundown and needs "a complete new look"	Unclear how this would support the objectives.
Earby Christmas Lights refresh	This is already within the considered proposals
Kelbrook festive decorations	Precedent has been set in supporting parishes, this would be valid.
Youth projects	The level of funding (Capital) available would be small in supporting such projects.
