ANNEX 1 – Mandatory Conditions

1. A1.
There will be no supply of alcohol -

A1.1
at a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence, or
A1.2
at a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his Personal Licence is suspended.

A2.
The supply of alcohol must be made or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence.

A3.
When a film is exhibited, admission of children to that part of the premises must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the British Board of Film Classification or any successor body (BBFC) in relation to that film.

A4.
Where no recommendation exists from the BBFC or the Council notifies the holder of the Premises Licence under section 20(3)(b) Licensing Act 2003, the admission of children will be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the Council.

A5.
All persons carrying out security activity at the premises must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

The following conditions came into force on 6th April 2010, amended with effect from 1st October 2014

A6.
(1)
The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
(2)
In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
(a)
games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
(i)
drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
(ii)
drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
(b)

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provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(c)

provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(d)

selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;

(e)

The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

A7.

The responsible person must ensure that free potable tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The following conditions came into force on 1st October 2010, amended with effect from 1st October 2014

A8

(1)

The Premises Licence holder or Club Premises Certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2)

The Designated Premises Supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3)

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either -

(a)

a holographic mark, or

(b)

an ultraviolet feature.

A9.

The responsible person must ensure that -

(a)

where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -

(i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

(b)

these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c)

where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

The following condition came into force on 28th May 2014

A10.

A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

For the purpose of the condition set out in paragraph 1 -

(a)

'duty' is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979 [1];

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(b)

'permitted price' is the price found by applying the formula $P = D + (D \times V)$, where

P - is the permitted price

D - is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

V - is the rate of Value Added Tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the Value Added Tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c)

'relevant person' means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a Premises Licence -

(i)

the holder of the Premises Licence

(ii)

the Designated Premises Supervisor (if any) in respect of such a Licence, or

(iii)

the Personal Licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a Licence;

(d)

'relevant person' means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a Club Premises Certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e)

'Value Added Tax' means Value Added Tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994 [2].

Where the permitted price given by paragraph(b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

1] Sub-paragraph 2 applies where the permitted price given by paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ('the first day') would be different from the permitted price on the next day ('the second day') as a result of a change to the rate of duty or Value Added Tax.

[2] The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

ANNEX 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

2. B1. Prevention of Crime and Disorder

B1.1

The Designated Premises Supervisor, or responsible person nominated by him/her, shall be an active member of the local PubWatch, where such a scheme exists.

B1.2

The extension of permitted hours in relation to the sale by retail of alcohol and the provision of late night refreshment in the event of the broadcast transmission of any recognised international event which falls outside current permitted hours, shall only be authorised if written notice of the proposed event, giving full details of the activity, has been given to the Lancashire Constabulary - Pennine Division Licensing Unit at least 10 days before the date of the event and provided no written notice of objection has been served on the Designated Premises Supervisor by the Police.

B2. Public Safety

B2.1

Where existing, the CCTV system shall continue to operate during the additional hours.

B3. Prevention of Public Nuisance

B3.1

Reasonable steps shall be taken to recognise the rights of local residents and to encourage customers to leave the premises quietly.

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B3.2

Managers are required to liaise with local neighbours as part of their duties and to resolve any reasonable concerns in accordance with the Company's role in the community guidelines.

B4. Protection of Children from Harm

B4.1

Access by children to the premises is restricted in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003.

B4.2

Managers and staff shall ensure that alcohol is not served to customers under 18 years of age and shall be briefed on the importance of their responsibilities in this regard.

B4.3

The age of children in these conditions is as defined by the relevant legislation.

B4.4

No adult entertainment (paid for by the company of a nude, physical nature) shall take place at the premises.

B4.5

Any children under 16 years of age shall remain the responsibility of the accompanying adult when using the premises and/or exterior areas.

B4.6

Staff are not permitted to be in sole supervision of children. Children shall remain the responsibility of the accompanying adult at all times.
